
MAYOR'S MESSAGE by Mayor Dave Phillips

People are busy cleaning their yards and hauling off trash and other debris (thank you Wasatch County for the 3 free permits that were on the garbage bill!) I hope everyone takes this opportunity to clean up and beautify our city. Lawns are greening up and sprinkler systems are running. The city parks are green, and the Parks and Cemetery team has been busy mowing lawns and cleaning around the public buildings and areas.

If you have been inside city hall these past few months, you've noticed the walls have been painted with a fresh coat of paint and new carpeting has been installed throughout the building. The painters are now busy chipping, sealing, and painting the wood trim on the exterior of the beautiful old Tabernacle. Neighbors who take pride in their homes and yards and clean up need a little help, and that's from each of us: Let's make sure we haul off our trash and clutter and keep our yards looking nice, too.

Another reminder: Heber City has a new program to contact its citizens by phone, email and text messages, informing them of water issues, emergencies, community events, etc. This system is only as good as your contact information being in the system and our ability to contact you. Messages were sent out recently concerning road closures, construction on SR 113 (Midway Lane) and secondary water issues. The Council is finalizing its annual budget and emergency

preparedness is playing a key role in our budget this year. This messaging system is one of several improvements we're making in the preparedness arena.
