The Utah League of Cities and Towns just wrapped up its annual 3-day convention in Salt Lake City. Heber City elected officials, city manager, city engineer, city planner and some of our planning commission members attended these workshops which covered a variety of topics germane to cities. We appreciate their taking time out of their busy schedules to attend these training workshops where they can learn more about their duties and stay abreast on state laws and ordinances.

If you've traveled along 300 West in the last six weeks, you've noticed the sidewalk that has been installed from Midway Lane all the way to 1000 South. In some portions, the sidewalk covers both sides of the street, driveways and curbs. Heber City will install new sidewalk on both sides of 100 South (Midway Lane) this coming spring. considered a part of the walking trail that originates in Heber City and terminates in Midway. The City Council wants to provide the public with a safe sidewalk to use as part of our trails system. Additionally, Heber City teamed up with UDOT to replace the sidewalk on the east side of Main Street between 500 and 600 South. It's been a construction-filled summer around the city, with road-cuts here and there, new sidewalks, water line replacements, etc. We appreciate your tolerance and understanding. The City Engineer is in the process of working out an acceptable intersection on 600 South and 300 West, and there's still some work to do on that busy corner.

Ramona Pace, Heber's new code enforcement officer, has done an outstanding job working with the public in correcting out-of-line situations that run from illegal parking of vehicles, boats, trucks and campers on city streets, to cluttered yards and unsafe conditions throughout the city. Thanks to

Ramona and those of you who have worked hard to clean up your yards and find places to park your boats and campers, trailers, etc. instead of using city streets. This provides for a safer community, and helps us to maintain a clean city look of which we can be proud.

The Veteran's Memorial is underway for our city cemetery. We appreciate Ralph Lugton, Steve Anderson (American Legion post) and local architect Lane Lythgoe for their work in taking the lead on this project. We appreciate all of those who are serving on the committee. A special account has been set up at Zion's Bank (Heber City Veterans Memorial) for those who wish to contribute financially towards this Memorial.
