MAYOR'S MESSAGE by Mayor Dave Phillips

There's an increasing problem taking place primarily on Main Street in Heber City and it involves drivers who aren't stopping for pedestrians. When they do stop, they often continue on as soon as the pedestrian is out from in front of their car, but not out of the crosswalk. The state law requires

drivers to remain stopped until pedestrians are out of the crosswalk all together. We have addressed this in prior news articles. A driver who stopped for a pedestrian recently counted 19 cars that kept going by before one



stopped, and 18 cars traveling in the other direction. Even with flags at marked crosswalks, it's becoming more difficult for pedestrians to cross Main Street. I have discussed this with our Chief of Police and law enforcement is going to keep a closer eye on this starting now. This is too serious an issue to take lightly, so drivers need to be aware and obey the law. A reminder to pedestrians - just because the nearest car to you stops doesn't mean that other drivers will also stop, so please be aware of your circumstances as you use the crosswalks in the city. We need to fix this situation before someone is seriously harmed or killed.

DOOR TO DOOR SALESMEN

The selling of goods, wares, and merchandise, or soliciting orders requires a <u>HEBER CITY BUSINESS LICENSE</u>. No person shall operate a transient sales business without this license. It shall be unlawful for any person under the age of 18 to engage in transient sales. All applicants <u>MUST</u> be subjected to a background investigation and possess a valid driver's license. Each person engaged in transient sales shall display their permit on their persons at all times when engaged in business for which a license is granted. If they <u>DO NOT</u> display their permit, don't hesitate to notify the Police Department at 654-3040.
