With spring just around the corner, Heber Valley Animal Services would like to remind all dog owners of Heber City's leash law. The leash law is to protect your pet and community members from dangers such as:

- 1. Being hit by a passing vehicle
- 2. Chasing children, animals, and vehicles
- 3. Damaging neighbor's property
- 4. Creating nuisances within our community

A shock collar or a training collar does not
