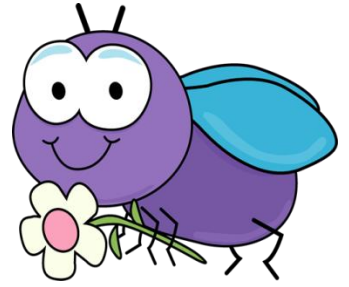

MAYOR'S MESSAGE

Every spring I think of the flowers that are springing up, lawns that are turning green, weeds that are getting a head start on summer, and how as residents of Heber City we should take the time to clean up our yards. I was talking with a resident the other day and she asked me why some people take such good care of their places and others have yards that don't look so good (I think she used the word "awful.") Great question and where an obvious answer might be that the person doesn't care, this might not always be the case. Some people suffer from bad health and while they wish they could have better looking houses and cleaner yards, they're kept from being able to do that. Sure, I think we're always going to have the kind of residents who just don't care, but I'm proud to report that the city is full of people who do care, and who get in and clean up their yards and haul off their trash and debris. Ramona Pace, our code enforcement officer, continues to do a great job in helping people come into voluntary compliance, and takes follow-up legal action when residents refuse to cooperate.



Spring is a great time for all of us to look around our homes and yards and see what we can do to make them look better. May I suggest that we not only take care of ourselves where possible, but be our brother's keeper as well? In years past, I've talked about people who not only take care of their own yards, but they are so good to help their neighbors. Wasatch County administers the trash and garage pickup each week (not Heber City) through a special service district and each spring they issue residents 3 free passes to haul trash and garbage to what I still call the "dump" (the transfer station where you can drop off trash to be hauled off to a land-fill). Those 3 free passes came on

our last quarterly billing. The County is doing its part towards helping our community clean up and look good. Recently a writer wrote the Wave and had concerns about the cost of this service (mistakenly thinking Heber City charges this fee and was responsible for the program). In talking with a friend at Wasatch County this past week, I learned our County actually has one of the lowest costs for this type service in the State of Utah. To all of us, let's clean up, spruce up, haul away, and help our neighbors in the coming months as we beautify our city and community.

NOTICE OF MUNICIPAL OFFICES to be voted on in the Heber City Municipal General Election -- November 5, 2013:

Mayor	4 year term
2 City Council Members	4 year term each

Candidate filing period is June 3, 2013 through June 6, 2013 during normal office hours. The filing period was shortened by the Utah State Legislature in order to accommodate the time needed to send ballots to military personnel stationed overseas. Declaration of Candidacy forms or Nomination Petitions must be filed in person with the City Recorder at 75 North Main, Heber City, Utah, during normal business hours.

In accordance with Heber City Code, individuals filing as candidates for the Heber City Council or for Mayor shall pay a \$50.00 fee at the time of filing their candidacy with the City Recorder. This filing fee shall be refundable only if it is determined that the person filing is not qualified to be a candidate, or who is found to have improperly filed. (Ord. 2003-25, 2003)
