SNOW SHOVELING SAFETY

With all that snow shoveling ahead of us, here are some tips to make sure that your pursuit of clean sidewalks and driveways is a safe and successful one.

Prep work: warm up before you start, it is exhausting work. Dress for the part: warm clothing will help you work longer. Technique is everything:

it's always best to push more than to lift the snow. Pace yourself: staying within your capacity



during heavy shoveling can stave off serious cardiovascular issues. Watch for warning signs: your body is very skilled at letting you know when you're getting tired and when to quit shoveling. When you clean off your sidewalk and driveway, it's much safer for emergency personnel and your loved ones to gain access to your house.


DOG LICENSING

All dogs in Wasatch County aged four months and older must be licensed. **All annual dog licenses expire December 31st and must be renewed each January.**

Lifetime dog licenses are also available. For lifetime licenses, proof of rabies vaccination must be provided to the City for our records whenever your dog has been given a new rabies shot (every three years). Lifetime dog license holders will receive a reminder from the City on the month their dog's rabies certificate expires, requesting they provide updated rabies information for the City's records. Upon receipt of the new rabies certificate, the City will issue lifetime dog license holders with a new tag, good for another three years. Dog licenses may be obtained at the City Treasurer's Office, 75 North Main Street. Proof of rabies vaccination is required for all first time applications and renewals.

License Fees:

- Annual** - altered: \$20.00
- Annual** - unaltered: \$40.00
- Lifetime** - altered: \$40.00
- Lifetime** - unaltered: \$60.00
