THINK CRIME PREVENTION: BURGLARY PREVENTION

Are your home and belongings safe while you are away?

Heber City Police Department has come up with a checklist to help prevent burglaries here in Heber City. Following this checklist can possibly help prevent your home or business from being burglarized and you becoming a victim.

- ✓ If possible, install an alarm system in your home or business.
If an alarm system is already installed, be sure to advertise that the residence or business is monitored by an alarm system.
- ✓ Keep all shrubs and trees near your residence or business well maintained and trimmed down.
Shrubs blocking windows and doors could help create cover for a burglar to hide.
- ✓ Keep the area around and inside your home well lit.
When leaving for a vacation or extended period of time, use timers to turn lights on to make it appear that you are home.
- ✓ Never leave a house key in an obvious place like under a doormat, potted plant, or in your mailbox. Make sure all doors, windows, and garage doors are shut and locked.
- ✓ Avoid daily deliveries of mail, newspapers, or flyers.
Make arrangements with a neighbor to check for these items regularly. To stop your mail, you can go to the Post Office and fill out a Hold Mail form while you are gone.
- ✓ Do not leave valuable items in plain view or in the front yard.
Make a list of your valuable items and store them in a secure place in your home or business. The list should include the serial numbers, makes and models of each item.

What to do if your home or business is broken into?

STOP. If a window or door is broken, do not enter the residence or business; the suspect may still be inside. Use a cell phone or a neighbor's phone to call the police (**Heber Dispatch 435-654-1411**). Do not touch anything inside the residence or business until the police have inspected the area for evidence. Make a note of any suspicious persons that may be in the area, also write down and license plates of suspicious vehicles; inform the police of these notes to help with their investigation. Please inform police of all suspicious activity while it is occurring.
