I attended a breakfast this past Saturday morning with several volunteer members of the Wasatch County Citizens Corps Council. The Chair of this Council (W4C) is Larry London, with Vice Chair Bill Shuster, CERT Coordinator Bill Hjelm, Secretary Darlene London, and State Emergency Coordinator (HAM) Doug Thompson. Several other key volunteers attended this potluck breakfast. The CERT program educates people about disaster preparedness for hazards that may impact their area and trains them in basic disaster response skills, such as fire safety, light search and rescue, team organization, and disaster medical operations. Using the training learned in the classroom and during exercises, CERT members can assist others in their neighborhood or workplace following an event when professional responders are not immediately available to help. CERT members also are encouraged to support emergency response agencies by taking a more active role in emergency preparedness projects in their community.

In our community, the CERT teams have been instrumental in working with the police department and other agencies in coordinating a variety of services. We are grateful to these men and women for spending their own time and resources in preparing for, and participating in, events that benefit our community. We owe these folks a big thank you for all they do.
